EAA 402 purchased this brick with money from the Jack Maki Memorial Fund. There was a great representation of Maki family and 402 members to honor our deceased WWII veteran, carrier pilot and friend Jack Maki.

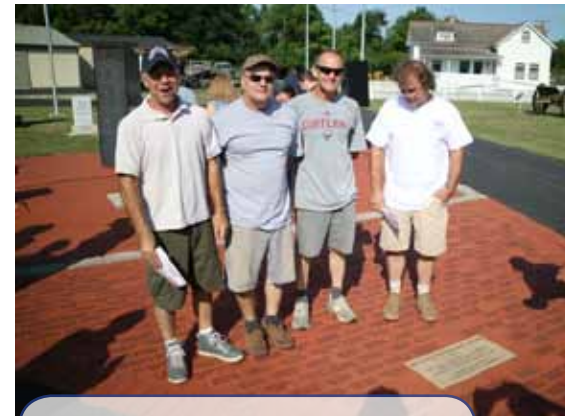
The entire event was wonderful, and included vets from every conflict since and including WWII. The anthem and a 21 gun salute were finishing touches.

The museum is located at 5075 South Hamilton Road, Groveport, Ohio 43125-9336. Those of us who attended could not believe how great this museum is, and that most of us had never been there! They are working on a 9/11 exhibit, and have the second largest collection of memorabilia. Mr. Mott showed us a Port Authority fire truck from

the scene. The company had been inside the tower and their chief ran in and told them to get out. They took refuge under the truck and were all saved, except for the chief, who didn't make it back out of the building. It was remarkable to think anyone under this truck lived, as it was a crushed hunk of metal.

Treasurer's Report: Ken Hughes gave the treasurer's report. The starting balance as of June 16th was \$2692.75. Contributions to the utility fund \$78.00. Scrap metal sales \$8.00. Utilities paid: \$73.18. Ending Balance July 19, 2016 \$2705.57. Reserves: Jack Maki Memorial Fund \$840; Beacon restoration fund \$100; Utility fund \$306.88; Young Eagles fund \$300.09. Outstanding receipts: \$621.23 (reimbursement from EAA for YE credits.) Ending balance less reserves plus outstanding receipts \$1779.83. Jim Wright moved to accept the report.
