Treasurer Report: Treasurer Kenneth Hughes presented the report dated June 20, 2017. The starting balance as of May 16, 2017 was \$3520.84. Dues payments of \$24.00 were received. Contributions of \$49.00 were received. Donations to Young Eagles Reserves of \$153.79 were received. Merchandise sales were \$187.00. Expenses were as follows: \$129.74 for utilities, \$510.77 for miscellaneous other. Ending balance was \$3154.12. The following reserve were included in the ending balance: Jack Maki Memorial fund, \$840.00; Beacon Restoration Fund, \$100; Utility Fund, \$136.23; Young Eagles Fund, \$113.99 for a total of \$1190.22. Motion to accept the report was made by Carl Braddock and seconded by Jim Wright. The motion carried.

Airport Board: Bill Corban reported that all is about the same and continuing forward as previously reported.
