Air Race Classic comes to VTA

The Air Race Classic (ARC) takes place over four days in June, specifically the 19th through 22nd. This is a handicapped race for women pilots and there are 55 teams of women pilots, 22 of them being university teams. The race starts at Sweetwater, TX (KSWW0 and ends at Fryeburg, ME (K1ZG) with eight stops in between. Newark-Heath (VTA) is the 7th stop so I estimate the bulk of the racers may be here on the 3rd day, June 21st. Most legs are about 2.5 hours although Newark is at the end of the longest leg at over 3 hours. I expect most planes will stop for fuel at Newark. (Planes can be timed on a fly-by and don't have to land.)

The organizers are asking for assistance from volunteers and groups such as EAA, 99's and WIA along the way. (I was told by the route director that EAA chapters are always helpful.)

Finding and training sufficient people to clock arrivals and departures (timers) seems to be critical. They have some experienced ARC timers coming to Newark to take the lead on timing and two experienced women will

be the “Stop Co-Chairs” but need more timers and other volunteers. The organizers will provide the necessary equipment.

Some ways we could include:

- Timing
- Check-in
- Cooking hot dogs/burgers (Carl, Weinermeisters?)
- Water/Drinks
- Assistance in finding lodging
- Transport to hotels/restaurants
- Marshalling planes, parking planes
- Transport to the Works (Jerrie Mock display)
- Also, I would suggest we open the club house to provide additional rest room facilities.

We will be volunteering individually and not as an EAA event. Thanks for reading this.

Minutes of Mar 2018 EAA402 Meeting

The regular meeting, held at the chapter clubhouse, was called to order at 1900 hours by President Barney Kemter. Barney welcomed all, thanked them for coming and then opened the meeting, as is customary, with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were fifteen members present.


Secretary's Report: The president asked for additions or corrections to the minutes of the February meeting as printed in the newsletter. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Rollie Bailey and seconded by Carl Braddock. The motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Ken Hughes presented the report dated March 20, 2018. The starting balance was \$1684.18. Dues payments of \$36.00 were received. Donations of \$135.00 to the Utility Fund were received. Utilities paid were \$118.97. Other costs for the month were \$75.93. Ending balance was \$1681.28 including \$100 in the Beacon Fund and \$840 in the Jack Maki Memorial fund. Motion to accept the report was made by Bernie Volpe and seconded by Ralph Brandon. The members approved the motion.

Newsletter: No Report

Old Business:

- **Young Eagles Credits:** The secretary reported that we have received 229 credits with a value of \$1145 which we can use in several different ways. The secretary explained the different ways. The primary use would be to sponsor a child at one of the EAA Air Academy sessions. The secretary has learned that there are no openings remaining for the Air Academy for this year. We could use the credits for chapter use to improve our YE program and/or return the credits to EAA's YE program. After much discussion, and a number of proposals, Bill Corban motioned that we keep half the credits and return half to EAA. The motion was seconded by Ralph Brandon. The motion carried. It was suggested that we could use our half of the credits to purchase printer and photo supplies and perhaps to purchase an additional 10 white shirts/epaulets.
- **Tee-Shirts to sell at events:** There was a lengthy discussion about the purchase of new Tee-shirts, the graphic to use, etc. There were too many open questions and no solution was forthcoming therefore the subject was tabled until next meeting. Several members volunteered to do some research into costs and choice of graphics. Red Caps to sell at events: There was a short discussion about the purchase of additional red ball caps to sell at our events. Tom has a quote from Casey Claxon, our previous supplier, of \$8.00 apiece. A motion was made by Rollie Bailey that we purchase 24 caps at a cost of \$8.00 each. The motion was seconded by Ken Hughes and passed by the members
- **Young Eagles-CAP event:** Tom briefed the group on the plans for the special CAP Young Eagles event of May 12th. Tom will send out an email before the event outlining the event for our volunteers. Tom has asked the CAP leader to have the cadets wear street clothes and shoes

- The airport board is working with a contractor to determine some of the costs for new hangar construction.

New Business:

The members applauded Ken for his efforts in getting this done.
