Harrison Ford Flies Young Eagles

Young Eagles Program News, Chino, California — June 3, 2008

While fans of Harrison Ford were eagerly awaiting the opening of *Indiana Jones and the Kingdom of the Crystal Skull*, a group of children in San Bernardino County, California didn't have to wait to see the megastar.

Ford was piloting the airplane they were in.

Ford, EAA Young Eagles chairman, flew seven Young Eagles in his 1958 DH-2 deHavilland Beaver at the Chino Airport on April 12, as part of an EAA Chapter 92 Young Eagles Flight Rally. Altogether, 32 youth received free airplane rides that day.

"Free airplane rides are just part of the flight rally," said Cliff Carpenter, Young Eagles coordinator. "We are building one-to-one relationships between pilots and young people, giving a new generation a chance to learn more

about the possibilities that exist in the world of aviation."

Carpenter said Ford's appearance was coordinated through the Chino Airport manager, who has been trying to improve the community's image of the airport, and EAA Chapter 92 President Ray Hecker. Other local celebrities also attended, including Chino Hills Mayor Curt Hagman and Fourth District Supervisor Gary Ovitt.

"Mr. Ford was just a pilot flying kids, which he loves to do, at an EAA Young Eagles rally," Hecker said.

Carpenter agreed. "He wasn't there as Harrison Ford the actor, but rather as the chairman of the Young Eagles program. He really supports the Young Eagles program and all the wonderful opportunities it affords the kids."

As chairman for Young Eagles, Ford promotes the program and, when possible, gives children a ride in one of his airplanes. In fact, he has flown nearly 300 Young Eagles since he first participated in the program in 2001.

Ford joined EAA after earning his pilot's certificate in 1996. He also holds seaplane, rotorcraft and instrument ratings.

"Young Eagles gives kids a view of the world they've never seen before and I am here today to fly kids," Ford said when he accepted the national Young Eagles chairman position. "Each Young Eagle flight is an opportunity to excite kids by sharing a passion for flight and to show them that they can participate in aviation at any level."

Carpenter said the event went well and reaction was very positive. But



it was clear and beautiful for the morning flight and brunch. Rollie Bailey, Charlie Rhoades, and Sam Huff flew, and their planes contained a number of guests. Dale and Wendy served a hearty breakfast of eggs, bacon, sausage, biscuits, gravy, french toast, and fruit. Several Hale's Landing residents attended and swapped tales with members, and a fine time was had by all!
