Thanks to all of the Chapter 402 membership who come together to make events like these possible and the dream of flight attainable for so many in our community.



Twelve Rules for Airplane Pilots

1. Every take-off is optional.
Every landing is mandatory.
2. If you push the stick forward, the houses get bigger. If you pull the stick back, they get smaller. That is, unless you keep pulling the stick all the way back—then they get bigger again.
3. Flying isn't dangerous.
Crashing is what is dangerous.
4. It's always better to be down here wishing you were up there than up there wishing you were down here.
5. The propeller is just a big fan in front of the plane used to keep the pilot cool. When it stops, you can actually watch the pilot start sweating.
6. You know you've landed with the wheels up if it takes full power to taxi up the ramp.
7. The only time you have too much fuel is when you're on fire.
8. The probability of survival is inversely proportionate to the angle of arrival. Large angle of arrival, small probability of survival, and vice versa.
9. Always try to keep the number of landings you make equal

to the number of take-offs you've made.

10. It's always a good idea to keep the pointy end going forward as much as possible.
11. There are three simple rules for making a smooth landing. Unfortunately, no one knows what they are.
12. Remember that gravity is not just a good idea, it's the law. And it's not subject to repeal.
