## Fly-in / YE Success Despite the Weather!

The Fly-in Breakfast / Young Eagles Day was a huge success, despite a slow start due to low ceilings. Saturday, September 6, from 8:00 am to noon, was the annual 402 Chapter event. Weather kept fly IN numbers low, but attendance and enthusiasm was still high! Young Eagles flights finally began at 10:00 am, and there was a long list of young people signed up and waiting. At 10:30 Bob Marriott began work with Scouts pursuing their aviation badges. Flights continued well past the scheduled cutoff of noon, in an effort to get as many participants up as possible. A number of folks agreed to take a rain check, and were flown Sunday, or have yet to be flown. The Civil Air Patrol volunteered again and were huge contributors to the day. President Michael Harris passed along these statistics:

- 165 breakfasts sold, gave out 93 coffees and bottled water with the breakfast.
- Sold 106 coffees, bottled water, cans of pop and juice @ \$1 each.

## Minutes – August 19, 2008 EAA 402 Meeting
