
Tour the Yorktown and Beautiful Charleston, SC

 - The caterer (Doug's Far Side Catering) only took his expenses and would not take any profit.
 - Everyone thought the breakfast was good and we should invite Doug to cater again next year.
 - The 50/50 drawing was won by Teresa McGinnus, Forrest Garey's daughter. Michael took winnings of \$20 to her home.
