Minutes—July 21, 2009 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7:03 pm by President Michael Harris after the pot-luck dinner. There were fourteen members and one visitor present. The visitor was Karen Hartmann.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

Michael welcomed the members and visitor.

Secretary’s Report: The June meeting minutes were accepted as published in the July newsletter after one correction. Bill Corban asked that the stated location of the Mott’s Military Museum be corrected from Obetz to Groveport. Motion to accept was made by Rollie Bailey, seconded by Jesse Ours, and passed by the members.

Treasurer’s Report: Treasurer Dan Robins was again not in attendance. Michael explained to the members that the officers had agreed to open another bank account so the accumulated cash could be deposited and checks could be written to pay outstanding bills. Michael opened the account in the Huntington National Bank, Granville Branch with an initial deposit of \$779.86. Michael will continue to attempt to get in touch with Dan and see what is going on and collect the chapter’s money, keys, membership cards, etc.

Michael also explained that Tom McFadden will temporarily take over the treasurer’s function. Tom has the new checking account book and the accounts payable as of this evening. The accounts payable are:

- Affordable Portables, \$80.25; Bill Corban reimbursement for the clubhouse back flow test, \$55.00 and
- Dream Big Flyers, \$333.84 for 48 Fly-In T-shirts.

Motion to accept the report was made by Bernie Volpe, seconded by Bob Marriott and passed by the members.

Newsletter/Web Editor: No report. (Absent)

Membership Coordinator: No report (Absent)

Airport Board: Our representative Bill Corban reported that one of the Koch buildings can be kept almost intact. Only a small portion must be removed according to the FAA. The FBO will probably use the building for heavy equipment storage.

Old Business

Discussion of what to do about a chapter mail box continues. Several members had checked on the cost of renting a P.O. Box. Michael reported it would cost \$60/yr at Heath and Tom reported that it would cost \$44/yr in Granville. Michael observed that this would be equivalent to the annual dues for 4 or 5 members and it was agreed that we should rather consider installing a mail box at the clubhouse. After considerable discussion it was decided that we should determine the cost of a lockable box and where we can install it.

- Tom will file the event form with the EAA and get the insurance coverage.
- Jack and Kenny will cover auto parking.
- Michael will arrange for YE pilots.
- Bernie will be in charge of ground operations.
- Tom will oversee YE registration and certificates.
- Michael will see Harold and get permission for use to use the main hangar for the breakfast.
- We will meet at the airport on Friday evening, Sept 11th to set up.
- A motion was made by Rollie Bailey and seconded by Bob Marriott that the chapter provide free drinks for the CAP and EAA volunteers throughout the day of the event. The motion carried.
