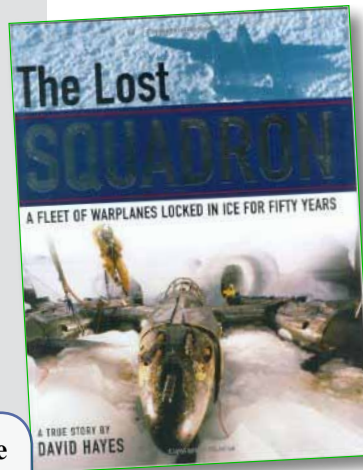

Dinner with a Slice of History May 8, 2015

Jerrie Mock's Round the World Flight presented by Wendy Hollinger
At
The International Women's Air & Space Museum
Burke Lakefront Airport

Dinner will be served at 6:30 pm with the program starting at 7 pm.



Ohio native Jerrie Mock (1925-2014) was the first woman to fly solo around the world. She made the flight in 1964 in an 11 year old Cessna 180 which is now hanging in the Smithsonian's Udvar-Hazy Center. Jerrie was a 38 year old housewife with only a Private Pilot's license, and less than 700 flying hours. She flew into countries where, even today, women are not allowed to drive. She landed at a secret military base, dealt with severe icing and flew through sandstorms. But she completed over 23, 200 miles in 29 days, 11 hours, and 59 minutes, and was awarded an FAA medal by President Lyndon Johnson.

Jerrie's book, *Three-Eight Charlie*, has been out of print for many years. Wendy Hollinger and Dale Ratcliff, volunteered to publish a new edition for the 50th anniversary of her flight, and met with Jerrie and reviewed her memorabilia. They spent hours interviewing her and photographing her materials, and became passionate about sharing her story. Please join us for this incredible story.

Minutes of March 2014 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 7 PM by President Bernie Volpe. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were fourteen members and two visitors present.

Visitor George O'Donnell representing the Columbus Challenge Grant, made a presentation to the Chapter regarding the fund raising effort for the stabilization of the old Columbus tower.

Secretary's Report: There was no Secretary's report because Tom was not present. The Minutes of the January meeting as printed in the Newsletter were approved by the membership.

(Secretary's Note: there was no February meeting due to inclement weather.)

Treasurer's Report: Ken provided printed reports for January and February, and reviewed the February report. As of March 17th the financial report is as follows: Starting balance was \$2,522.53; Income from dues was \$36.00; Utilities paid \$113.56; Payment for Red Caps from June 2014 order \$190.48. Ending balance \$2254.49. Utility reserves (\$26.39). Young Eagles reserves \$383.55.

Rollie Bailey moved to accept the report, Charlie seconded, and it was approved by voice vote.

Fly-out Report: Rollie Bailey stated that fly-outs this year have been a disaster. Bad weather so far this year has prevented most of the scheduled events. Rollie thinks maybe the fly-out to Carroll County next Saturday (TSO) might be a go, depart VTA 8:30 am. We're staying close to home for now, and will be good to go in another month.

Airport Board Report: Rollie shared that they tried to keep the beacon because of its historical value, and worked on the slip rings but have opted to buy a new one and install it. The old one will be kept though. Rollie noted that there are poles at Swifty's to close that area off. Money is allotted but just needs completed. Corporate overhead door is still on the to do list when weather gets better. Rollie noted also that we lease our clubhouse from George Fackler for \$1 per year. Bill Corbin has suggested that this be changed so that the clubhouse is leased from the Airport Board since it doesn't impact the FBO. Rollie also mentioned the new line boy who's name is Richard, and said he seems like a good guy and hard worker.

New Business

The secretary had sent in a letter from the EAA about the Young Eagles credits accumulated for the year 2014. The letter explained how we could either give the credits to the EAA Air Academy or redeem them for our own Young Eagles program. Tom wrote on the letter that he recommends that we give the credits of approximately \$980 to the Air Academy so that
