Minutes of Mar 2017 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting, held at the chapter clubhouse was called to order at 1900 by President Bernie Volpe and was opened with the pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were eighteen members and two visitors present. President Volpe introduced the visitors, Ken Sterling and Andrew Power.

Secretary Report: The secretary asked for additions or corrections to the minutes of the February meeting as published in the newsletter. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Barney Kemter and seconded by Charlie Rhoads. The motion carried.

Treasurers Report: Ken Hughes presented his usual very thorough report. The starting balance as of 2/21/2017 was \$2,836.90. Dues payments received \$66.00. Contributions to the Utility Fund were \$117.08. Other income was \$76.00. Expenses were \$37.26 for utilities and \$76.00 miscellaneous. Ending balance as of 3/21/2017 was \$2968.72. Reserves included in the ending balance are \$840 in the Jack Maki Fund, \$100 in the Beacon Marker Fund, \$280.28 in the Utility fund and \$113.96 in the Young Eagles Fund for a total of \$1334.48 in reserves. Motion to accept the report was made by Barney Kemter, seconded b Charlie Rhoads and passed by the members.

Fly-Out Report: Rollie Bailey, fly-Out coordinator, reported on the recent fly-outs (details are generally in the newsletters). The March 5th fly-out to Zanesville, ZZV, was well attended with 6 planes and 12 souls going to brunch at Denny's. The 3rd Saturday fly-out was cancelled due to weather. The next first-Sunday fly-out, April 2nd is planned to Port

Clinton (PCW) and departs at 10:30am. The third-Saturday fly-out, April 15th is planned to go to Cleremont County (I69) and Sporty's for free hot dogs. Depart at 10:30am. The fly-out May 20th is planned for Wadsworth (3G3) for breakfast and a car show. Depart at 8:30am.

Airport Board: Bill Corban made the report. Planning continues for realignment of the east taxiway. Terry Trenoff will continue as president of the board. Bob Erhard has taken the position of Vice President and will step in whenever necessary to fill in if Mr. Trenoff is unable to make a meeting. Mary Ann Duffy continues as secretary with a slight raise in pay. When asked about "secrecy" of the board meetings Bill responded that the meetings are not secret and that anyone is welcome attend the meetings which are held on the evening of the second Tuesday of each month at 5:00pm in the Newark-Heath Airport FBO building.

Introductions: At this point in the meeting President Volpe asked the members to introduce themselves to the visitors. After the introductions Rollie took the opportunity to remind everyone to make sure the screen doors to the clubhouse are securely latched when closed. The rear screen door has again been destroyed by the wind.

Old Business:

- Ken Hughes reported on his follow up on getting with Chapter 443 (Lancaster) about sharing Young Eagles credits with them. He has contact names, has provided them with details of the Air Academy Camps and has proposed several meeting dates with 443 and 402 representatives. Tom McFadden reported that he is continuing to follow up with the CAP but has yet to have a candidate to go to the Academy this summer. Barney suggested that his grandson might be a good candidate. Barney and Tom will follow up.
- Bernie asked if there was anything we need to do for the Young Eagles event of June 10th. The answer, at this time, is no.

New Business:

- President Bernie Volpe introduced the subject of an event to be held at the airport on Saturday, August 26th. This event is called Honor The Service (HTS) and will be held by the Friendship Club of Licking County along with veterans groups and other sponsors. The initial information indicates that this will be a big event and falls one week after our Pancake Breakfast date. Tom questioned whether this will interfere with our plans and whether we should attempt to be involved in it. Bernie said there is a meeting at the Heath Municipal Building on Monday evening March 27th which he is going to attend for the VFW. There was considerable discussion among the members and the consensus seemed to be that we may want to become involved in some way, perhaps as a vendor. Tom volunteered to attend the planning meeting on the 27th with Bernie to see what, if any, part we can play. There was consensus that we should change our Fly-In date to the 26th and throw in with the HTS event.

- Tom Thompson is at the point in building his Super Cub to cover and paint it.
- Dave Minnich has his engine assembled and ready to hang but is procuring the proper engine mounting bolts. He is starting the wiring of the plane.
