Minutes of June 2015 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 1900 by Vice President Rollie Bailey. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were twenty members and one guest, Bruce Pickard, present.

Secretary's Report: The secretary asked for any additions or corrections to the minutes of the May meeting as printed in the June newsletter. Motion to accept was made by Charlie Rhoads seconded by Bob Marriott and passed by the members.

Treasurer's Report: Ken Hughes provided a detailed report. As of June 15th the financial report is as follows: Starting balance was \$2,314.93; Income from dues was \$72.00; Other income was \$834.90 including \$81 from donations to the utility fund; \$208.90 from food stand donations at the YE rally; \$245.00 from T-shirt, hat and mugs sales at the YE rally and \$300.00 donation from VFW Post 1060. Utilities paid \$65.67; Other expenditures \$225.43 for supplies for the YE rally. Ending balance \$2930.73. Utility reserves \$112.72. Young Eagles reserves \$667.02. A motion to accept the report was made by Larry Arnold and seconded by Jim Wright. The motion carried.

Following the treasurer's report Larry Arnold made a motion that the donations of \$208.90, made at the food stand during the YE event, be transferred to the utility fund from the YE reserves. There was a some discussion and most members agreed this would be a good thing and the collection jar specifically says the donations are for the Utility Fund. A vote was taken and the motion passed.

Fly-out Report: Rollie reported that the June 20th Fly-Out will be to Port Clinton Airport to see the Tin Goose and the other planes there and a car show. The travelers can also eat in the restaurant there. Rollie says that on July 4th weekend the members should enjoy time with their families and there will be no 1st Sunday fly-out. The Fly-Out on July 18th will be to Mt. Victory (O74) grass strip for breakfast. Rollie says this is a tail-dragger's dream. Depart VTA at 8:00 AM.

On Saturday, October 3rd, the OSU Airport will be hosting an Open House and Don Scott Trot (a 5k run) on the runway. This will be a community-oriented event which invites the general public to experience the many facets of the aviation industry.

The 5K run/walk on the airport runways will be followed by a pancake breakfast, military demonstrations, tethered hot air balloon rides, a static display of vintage and classic aircraft, Young Eagles flights, and a variety of exhibit booths.

Airport Board Report: Bill Corban reported on the most recent Airport Board Meeting:

- The board has made the decision to paint hangar G and to paint the roof of the maintenance hangar with elastomeric coating.
- The decision was made to get electricity into the KOCH building at the west end of the field. Rollie is leading this effort.
- The engineering contract is being re-negotiated with the same firm as at present.
- Bill reported that the FBO lease is up for renewal and also the Harold Ware is talking of retiring.
- There was considerable discussion on building additional hangars and they will be getting estimates.
- The process of the purchase and installation of a new overhead door for the corporate hangar progresses. The contract has been let and one-half the money has been paid. When the old door has been taken down our member Roy Hurt will be taking the metal away.

Old Business:

Young Eagles Report:

Rollie praised and thanked all who flew or worked at the Young Eagles event and said it went very smoothly. Tom echoed the same thing and said the flight scheduling went very smoothly for the most part. There were sufficient volunteers on the ground to easily handle all the tasks of car parking, registration, scheduling, log books, photos, certificates, ramp safety, escorting (CAP). Larry and Carl cooked and served 150 hot dogs, gave out lots of water and did a great job. Thanks and kudos to all.

Tom presented the breakdown of Young Eagles flown as follows: Jeff Wheeler - 7; Bernie Volpe - 15; Barney Kemter - 4; Dick Perdue - 4; George Fackler - 18; Charlie Rhoads - 24; Jim Wright - 18; Bill Corban - 18; Michael Harris - 21. The total flown was 130.

Storms were starting to move in from the southwest and flying was terminated at just about noon. There were about 12 kids registered that had been unable to fly at that time. Charlie Rhoads volunteered to take the registrations and make individual arrangements to fly them at sometime in the near future.

- Tom reminded all of the upcoming event and mentioned some of the plans.
- Larry mentioned that Andrea Kemp will be at the Fly-In with her presentation on her skydiving record. Tom is contacting and scheduling other exhibitors and Bernie is contacting public officials.
