Our first Sunday October fly-out will be to the historic Stockport Mill, the last remaining mill on the Muskingum River. A mill has operated on the site since 1842 and today, hydroelectricity again powers the Stockport Mill.

Milling operations ceased in 1997, but reopened in 2000 as the Stockport Mill Inn and Restaurant on the Dam. Great care has been taken in preserving the original architecture and building materials. A dining terrace wraps around the Mill's first floor restaurant. A gift shop features many unique and local items. Antiques are on exhibit throughout the historic structure.

## Minutes of August 2016 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting, held in the clubhouse, was called to order at 1850 by President Bernie Volpe and was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were 19 members present.

**Secretary's Report:** The secretary asked for approval of the minutes of the July 19, 2016 meeting. Motion to accept the minutes was made by Charlie Rhoads, seconded by Jess Ours and accepted by the members present.

**Treasurer's Report:** Ken Hughes gave the treasurer's report. The starting balance as of August 16th was \$2,705.57. Dues collected \$36.00. Contributions to the utility fund \$55.00. Scrap metal sales \$6.50. Other income \$161.50. Utilities paid: \$71.52. Ending Balance August 16, 2016 was \$2893.05. Reserves: Pilots Prize Reserve \$150.00; Jack Maki Memorial Fund \$840; Beacon/Marker Restoration Fund \$100; Utility Fund \$290.36; Young Eagles fund \$300.09. Outstanding receipts: \$621.23 (reimbursement from EAA for YE credits.) Ending balance less reserves plus outstanding receipts \$1,883.83. Tom McFadden moved to accept the report. The motion was seconded by Larry Arnold and accepted by the members present.

**Fly-out Report:** Bernie reported for Rollie on the August 7th fly-out to Port Clinton (KPCW). Five planes and fourteen souls went on the fly-out. The plan was to have breakfast or brunch at the Tin Goose restaurant on the field, however there was an EAA pancake breakfast going on so the group had breakfast with EAA. The group got to see the visiting B17-G, Yankee Lady.

**New Members:** President Volpe asked visitor/new member, Bob Rohrer, to introduce himself. Bob has recently moved from Worthington to Granville. He got his private pilot's license in 1971 and has about 3000 hours at present. He has SEL, MEL, Glider, Ground Instructor and Inst/Advanced ratings.

**Airport Board:** In the absence of the normal airport board representatives, George Fackler reported on the last airport board meeting. He reported that the board has purchased a new tractor. George also said the board is considering adding new hangars to the first two hangar rows as there would be no site preparation necessary. Barney Kemter asked George if there has been any discussion of installing shed-type hangars or other open style hangars instead of closed hangars with the expensive overhead doors. George could not recall any discussions on this.

### Old Business:

- Barney Kemter reported that all but one of the back-ordered white shirts have been shipped and will be here by the Fly-In weekend.
- Fly out planning: Tom reviewed the status of the fly-out planning and asked for additional volunteers.
