
## Heart of Ohio Fly-Outs

## Minutes of October 2014 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting was called to order at 1900 pm by President Charlie Rhoads and was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag. There were 21 members present.

**Secretary's Report:** Secretary Tom McFadden was present, having been brought by Bill Corban. Tom, sitting in a wheel chair, asked to speak before giving the secretary's report. He thanked the members for all their visits, flowers, cards and prayers during his stay in the hospital and the rehab center. Tom thanked those who had taken over his duties during his absence, especially Wendy for taking the minutes during the August and September meetings. Charlie then asked for approval of the September minutes. Rollie Bailey motioned to accept the minutes. The motion was seconded by Carl Braddock and passed by the members.

**Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Ken Hughes gave the financial report. The balance was \$3067.00 including \$238.70 in the utility fund and \$473.55 in Young Eagles reserve. Ken also presented an analysis of utilities costs in response to a request by Bill Corban at the last meeting. A motion to accept the Treasurer's report was made by Larry Arnold, seconded by Dale Ratcliff and passed by the members.

**Fly-out Report:** Due to bad weather there was no Fly-Out on October the 18th therefore Charlie and Cathy drove to Celina to attend the Mickey Gilley concert. Charlie reports that it was great.

The first Sunday of November fly-out will be to Zanesville (ZZV).

The third Saturday of November fly-out will be to Findlay (FDY).

**Airport Board:** Several items were reported by Bill Corban.

- 1) The board has purchased the Swifty Gas Station and the previous owner has to clean up the site.
- 2) There has been no progress on getting a new overhead door for the corporate hangar although Roy and Rollie are still pursuing it.
- 3) A temporary repair has been made on the beacon.

### Old Business:

- The date of August 15th was set for the chapter's annual Fly-In Breakfast.
- Tim Hail and Larry Arnold reported respectively on their efforts to get a Black Hawk helicopter and the EAA Ford Tri-Motor in for the Fly-In. Nothing firm yet but they will continue working on similar things.


