**Secretary's Report** - The secretary asked for any additions or corrections to the minutes of the September meeting as printed in the October newsletter. Motion to accept was made by Jim Wright seconded by Barney Kemter and passed by the members present.

**Treasurer's Report** – Treasurer Ken Hughes gave the report. The ending balance as of October 20, 2015 was \$2685.06. Contributions to the utility

**Airport Board Report** - made by Rollie Bailey.

- Hangar painting is finished. The use of our electricity and water did not make much impact on our bills.
- Rollie said he has proposed that the airport board recover the land that was traded for the Davis-Shai House.
- Some money has been set aside for moving the east taxiway but not for moving the FBO.
- Most obstacles have been taken care of.
- There is still active talk about adding a row of hangars.

**Fly-out Report** - Rollie and Larry reported on the special fly-out to the Morgan County Airport (I71) and the Stockton Mill Inn; 7 planes, 13 people. Great time was had by all. See October newsletter for more details. November 1st fly-out will be to Portsmouth (PMH). Depart VTA at 8:30 AM. Third Saturday, November 21st will be to Sporty’s (I69). Check with Rollie on departure time.

**Old Business:**

- November Meeting Turkey dinner: Charlie Rhoads passed a list of the side dishes and food needed for the November dinner/meeting and secured volunteers to bring the items. Charlie asked that the food be brought to the clubhouse by 6:00PM on the meeting night, November 17th. The folks from the FBO will be invited to dine between 6-6:30 PM.

**50/50 Drawing:** The drawing was won by Larry Arnold. Larry donated his winnings to the treasury. The meeting was adjourned at approximately 1950.


