Minutes of October 2017 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting, held at the chapter clubhouse, was called to order at 1900 hours by President Bernie Volpe, and was opened with the recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. There were sixteen members present.

Secretary Report: Secretary Tom McFadden asked for additions or corrections to the minutes of the September meeting as published in the October newsletter. A motion to approve the minutes was made by Rollie Bailey, and seconded by Jim Wright. A vote was taken and the motion carried.

Treasurers Report: Treasurer Ken Hughes presented the report dated October 17, 2017. The starting balance was \$2,941.00. Dues payments of \$24.00 were received. Donations of \$52.00 to the Utility Fund and \$111.54 to the Young Eagles Fund were received. Expense for utilities was \$72.38. Other costs were \$272.06. Ending balance was \$2,784.10 including \$1,012.72 in reserve funds. Motion to accept the report was made by Rollie Bailey and seconded by Michael Harris. The motion carried.

“Dan Wolfe is an exemplary leader in our profession. He is an outstanding flight department manager and a model of giving back to the industry,” said NBAA President and CEO Ed Bolen, himself inducted into the Living Legends in 2009. “This honor could not be more well deserved, and it shines a bright light on the professionalism of business aviation.”

The Living Legends honors ceremony is presented each year by Kiddie Hawk Air Academy. Affiliated with the Airport Journals family of publications, Kiddie Hawk is a Colorado nonprofit dedicated to sparking young people’s interest in aviation.

Kiddie Hawk’s mission, as the charitable beneficiary of the Living Legends ceremony, is close to Wolfe’s heart. He’s been a longtime champion of professional development and mentoring the next generation of business aviation leaders – one of many reasons why he’s being recognized as a Living Legend.

“Like any humbled aviator, I was excited,” said Wolfe. “This is such a high-profile group, with Buzz Aldrin, Gene Cernan, Clay Lacy, Murray Smith and Morgan Freeman. I’m also excited about what Kiddie Hawk is doing. Their work getting kids excited about aviation will help our industry down the line.”

Wolfe attended the Living Legends ceremony once before, when the Nationwide Aviation Business Center was recognized as Professional Pilot’s flight department of the year. Nationwide has also earned NBAA’s 50-year

Newsletter: No Report

- New terminal building: A study is to be done in 2019 and it should be built by 2022.
- Taxiway re-alignment will be done next year.
- Board is again discussing the acquisition of land and fencing it on the North side of the field.
- Board is still discussing building additional hangars. Robertson Construction is interested but the board is looking for additional bidders.
- Bill mentioned the oil/fumes remediation effort that has been ongoing for years and continues.
- Someone mentioned that the EPA Super Fund has probably spent over a million dollars on this by now.

Old Business:

- Larry Arnold acknowledged his appointment at the last meeting as the one responsible for choosing the venue and making arrangements for our Christmas Dinner. He reported that he has made reservations with the Buckeye Lake Yacht Club. The menu has not yet been set. The cost will be \$25 per person.
- Larry took the floor to make an announcement. He said he has watched how hard Carl Oblinger works to cook the hot dogs and burgers for the meetings and decided to give Carl an honorary appointment as a Wienermeister with the rank of Corporal. Larry then presented Carl with a white shoulder rope with gold wiggly things!
- Nominations for Officers:

As a member of NBAA’s Business Aviation Management Committee, Wolfe helped develop a guide for flight department internship programs. He’s flown for Nationwide for more than 25 years, amassing in excess of 14,000 flight hours. As a manager, he’s partnered with Ohio colleges and universities to mentor aviation students. He’s also been a foster parent for more than 20 years.

“At this point in my career, it’s amazing to have the ability to give back,” said Wolfe. “I’ve always tried to pass on my aviation passion and knowledge while creating opportunities for people. I think it’s just part of what we’re supposed to do – leave the profession better than we found it.” [END]

- **Amendment to the Articles of Incorporation:**

The amendment shall be accepted as presented and the Secretary and Treasurer shall be empowered to complete the paper work and pay all fees associated with filing the amendment with the Secretary of State and filing for 501 (c)(3) status with the IRS. The motion was seconded by Rollie Bailey. After discussion, a quorum being present, the vote was taken and the motion passed unanimously.

New Business:

Steve Brown expressed an interest in becoming an EAA Technical Counselor. The secretary provided Steve with the proper application which Steve filled out, President Volpe signed for the chapter, and the secretary will mail into the EAA’s Safety office. The members showed their approval by applauding Steve.
