


Member's Wing

Glenn Borders

You know, we all have some stories to tell. Some happy, some sad, some short, some long. Each one has a special meaning to the teller. Well folks, I would like to tell you that we have a great story teller among us. Our very own chapter member Glenn Borders. During my short time with Glenn and his grandson, I was on the edge of my seat listening to stories of then and now, laughter and near tragedy. I wish that I could fit all of my notes into this one article but it would take several pages. So I will do my best to share what I can and I encourage you to contact Glenn and stop over for a little iced tea under a shade tree and experience a few stories for yourself. You won't regret it.



Glenn and his late wife Jessie were married for a terrific fifty-one years. They raised three wonderful daughters, Karen, Delana, Tama as well as a great son, Kevin. Glenn has several grandchildren and great grandchildren.

Glenn has been a member of the 402 for nine years and holds a private with commercial rating. He has over 450 hours logged and has owned a Cessna 170 and an Aeronca Chief.

Glenn's interest in flying began at the age of ten after his father took him to a movie about acrobatic flying. He began lessons in high school and continued his lessons while in the Navy. When he returned home from the Navy in 1947 he used the GI Bill to obtain his commercial rating. His dad helped him buy the 170 in May of 1952.

Glenn hasn't spent much time on aircraft projects, he preferred spending his time flying cross country trips and flying family. Glenn is all about family and has made many sacrifices over the years.

One of the exciting memories that Glenn shared was during his trip down to Cincinnati to his commercial exam. It was a cool frosty morning and a short while after takeoff he noticed the engine starting to run real rough. While researching for a location to divert to the thought struck him to turn on the carb heat. Presto, a smooth flight from then on. Ask Glenn about the trip back from Florida when he found himself flying in the dark with no compass, no radio and was able to sit it down in Middletown real quiet, tie it down and go home unnoticed. That was a good one. The terrifying memory which Glenn shared was a return trip in a 172 with his wife up front and their two daughters in the back. While attempting to land on a farm strip he came in too close on the down wind causing him to turn too steep on final which caused a stall. They ended up crashing in a culvert from approximately 200 feet. The good news is that everyone walked away with only minor bumps and bruises.

A few things about Glenn that you may not know... He is a master working with plaster and carpentry. He played the trombone in church and has handed it over to grandson Rodger, who plays up a storm.

Minutes of May 17 2011 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting, held at the clubhouse, was called to order by President Michael Harris at 7:02 pm. There were twenty-six members present. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. Michael welcomed all.

Secretary: Minutes of the April 2011 meeting were accepted as printed in the May 2011 newsletter on motion by Dan Glaze, seconded by Bob Marriott and passed by the members present.

Treasurer: Treasurer Larry Arnold gave the financial report. Starting balance: \$1,841.34. Donations to Utility Fund: \$29. Dues paid for 2011: \$24. Expenses paid: \$83.23. Ending balance: \$2419.11. Utility Reserves: \$128.92. Young Eagles Reserves: \$500.00. Motion to accept the report was made by Rollie Bailey, seconded by Ed Newbold and passed by the members. The secretary sent a thank-you letter to VFW Post 1060 for the \$500 donation for use in our YE program.

Newsletter Editor: Wendy thanked everyone for their contributions. Michael indicated he will be submitting the newsletter for the EAA contest.

Web Editor: Gary had nothing to report.

Airport Board: Bill Corban reported the following:

- Brent Doey is building a hanger and has been approved. It will be located East of the t-hangers on the runway side of the existing individual hangers.
- A grant is being sought for removal of the trees on the west end of the runway. It was reported that the homeowners have been interested and are cooperative.
- The COATC (old air force base) gifted the airport thirteen acres across Irving Wick Drive (where the fence has been damaged, by Heath Road) and has now asked for it back.
- Bidding is in process for the runway re-building project. The \$1,000,016 quote by Quest is lower than expected. It is required to be finished in 45 days and there is a \$1500 per day late fee. It looks as though the money may come through this year, and could be as early as late June, but Bill is still skeptical it will happen that quickly.

**Airport and Airway
Extension Act
Signed into law**

H.R. 1893, the “Airport and Airway Extension Act of 2011, Part II,” was signed into law by President Obama on May 31. Among other things, the law amends the Code to extend through June 30, 2011, increased excise taxes on aviation fuels, the excise tax on air transportation of persons and property, and the expenditure authority for the Airport and Airway Trust Fund. It also increases the authorization of appropriations for the nine-month period beginning on Oct. 1, 2010, for airport planning and development.
