




Heart of Ohio Fly-Outs



Answer: Spencer Canyon VFR check point (35 degrees 47.25' N, 113 degrees 38.80' W) , Grand Canyon, Arizona VFR Aeronautical Chart for general aviation. This view is from the 320 degree radial, 12 miles west of the Peach Springs VOR, between the Grand Canyon West Airport (1G4) and Peach Springs. 1G4 is 1494 miles west of KVTA.

Minutes of May 15, 2012 EAA 402 Meeting

The meeting, held at the clubhouse, was called to order by president Bob Boyd at 1902 hrs. There were nineteen members and one visitor present. The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag. The visitor, Brian Eley joined the chapter.

Secretary: The minutes of the April 2012 meeting were accepted as printed in the May 2012 newsletter on motion by Rollie Bailey, second by Larry Arnold and passage by the members present.

Treasurer: Treasurer Larry Arnold gave the financial report. Starting balance: \$2007.18. Donations to Utility Fund: \$43. The hat was passed and an additional \$47 was collected. Dues collected: \$36.00. Donation from VFW for Young Eagles: \$300.00. Expenses: \$78.15. Reserves: Utilities \$104.81; Young Eagles \$300.00. Ending Balance: \$2255.03. Motion to accept the report was made by Wendy Hollinger, seconded by Michael Harris and passed by the members present.

Fly-Outs: Rollie Bailey Fly-out Saturday the 19th will be to the Elliott's Landing (O74) 2750' grass strip at Mt. Victory. (Rollie says he can get airborne with a full load in 1600 feet.) Rollie asks for inputs for future fly-outs. June 2nd will be to Hales Landing south of Parkersburg, West Virginia. Bob Marriott may schedule a Cushman fly-out.

Newsletter Editor: Wendy apologized for lost newsletters/emails as her hard drive crashed.

Dale says it's possible that a couple from Ft. Worth may visit Newark-Heath when the airport is reopened.

Dick Perdue showed the members a dual chart comparing sectional views of VTA area from 1969 with how it looks now and remarked that numerous airports from back then have vanished or are no longer active. Dick stated that back then the rental fee for a Cherokee was \$12.80 per hour WET.

Old Business

Bernie Volpe, Young Eagles coordinator, reports that the event is still on for Newark-Heath for June 9th with an alternate date of June 23rd. Bernie discussed the responsibilities for registration and certificates is with Gary Kurtz; photos with Wendy Hollinger and Carl Oblinger; getting a porta-john, Michael Harris; Safety and Aircraft Parking, Dan Glaze; advertisement, Michael Harris and Bernie Volpe.
